BOOK CLUB....

Last month's book was 'Slow Horses' by Mick Herron. Published in 2010, it's the first in a series of spy novels featuring MI5 agents who, as a consequence of various misdemeanours, have been exiled to Slough House - a long way away from the key players and operations being run out of the main MI5 offices at Regent's Park. These disgraced agents are the 'Slow Horses' of the title, and they spend their time on data analysis and paper chasing until they either retire or resign.

The story revolves around the kidnapping of a young man, whose execution is due to be broadcast online as part of a political statement. However, as the plot unfolds we discover that the kidnapping is not what it seems, and the cynical machinations of MI5's most senior agents are revealed. The slow horses find themselves involved, and must work to ensure that they don't become the scapegoats for an increasingly out of control plot.

The book was enjoyed by most book club members. It was found to be irreverent, funny and entertaining as well as quite suspenseful. Some elements of the storyline were felt to be less convincing, but nevertheless it was fairly well received. Scores for the book ranged between 6 and 9; with the average coming out at 7.5

This month's book is 'Regeneration' by Pat Barker. Nominated for the Booker Prize, it is set in 1917 and tells the story of the treatment of shell shocked soldiers at Craiglockhart War Hospital in Scotland. Among the patients are Siegfried Sassoon and Wilfred Owen, and the book explores the impact of war on a generation of young men through their experiences and treatment.

Next months bookclub meeting is on Tuesday 12th April.




W.I....
