BOOK CLUB....

Last month's book was 'Sweet Sweet Revenge Ltd' by Jonas Jonasson. Translated from Swedish and published in the UK in 2021, this is a black comedy set partly in Stockholm and partly in Kenya.

The main character is Victor, an ambitious and ruthless man, who first tricks his young wife Jenny out of her inheritance; and then abandons his son Kevin to his fate in the middle of the Kenyan savannah.

When Kevin is subsequently rescued and adopted by a Maasai medicine man, he finds himself on the receiving end of some (painful!) traditional rituals, and quickly decides to return to Stockholm.

Once back in Stockholm, his path crosses the young cheated wife, and between them they hatch a plan to get even with Victor, and exact the 'Sweet, Sweet Revenge' of the title.

The style of the book is very unusual, with sentence structure and writing style being enjoyed by some people, who found it refreshingly different; but actively disliked by other people. The plot line was generally thought to be pretty far fetched, with lots of coincidences and crazy plot lines contributing to a lively discussion. Even the people who enjoyed it said they were glad to finish it!

The black comedy aspect of the novel also caused some differences of opinion, with some people finding it very funny; whilst others felt the humour missed the mark, and not everyone persevered to the end.

The scores for the book ranged from 4 to 7 - with the average coming out at 6.

Next month's book is 'The Neon Rain' by James Lee Burke. The first book in a highly acclaimed series introducing Dave Robicheaux, a New Orleans detective. Our next meeting will be Tuesday 10th August at 7pm - Judith New members welcome please contact Judith Finney on 07969 633997.

WOODCOCK SURVEY, TOCKHOLES



As a member of the British Trust for Ornithology (BTO), I volunteered to take part in a survey of the UK native woodcock population, which has been in serious decline to the point where it is estimated that only around 55,000 breeding pairs survive. Woodcock are on the red endangered list of UK birds, yet it is still legal to shoot woodcock for the table. Some birds from N. Europe arrive to feed over winter, but these depart by the end of March, meaning that any breeding birds here are native to the UK. The last BTO survey was done in 2013, in 955 1-km squares across the whole of the UK, selected to pinpoint woodland blocks where woodcock might breed. One of those blocks is in Tockholes, which is why I wanted to do the survey. My survey was completed on three separate occasions, beginning at 15 minutes before sunset and lasting 75 minutes, during late spring/early summer this year. You are very unlikely to see the ground nesting woodcock during the day because they are brilliantly camouflaged. However, just after dusk and dawn at this time of year the males begin to fly above the tree canopy calling to attract females, a performance known as "roding" which goes on for around 45 minutes. The survey entails counting the number of sightings and sounds of woodcock over the 75 minute period. They have a distinct call and fly fast and low over the tree canopy.

On my first session, I was giving up hope after half an hour that I would see any birds, fearing that the large number of visitors and free running dogs over the past year may be causing too much of a disturbance for breeding woodcock. However, I can reveal that a special part of Tockholes is a hotbed of woodcock roding, and thus a breeding ground for this reclusive bird. On the first visit to my count point, I saw 8 birds in flight and heard 3 others, the second visit 12 seen and 4 heard, but on my final visit I was rewarded with the astonishing sight of 24 birds in flight and heard 8 more. Silhouetted against the darkening sky, a woodcock in flight is a wonderful sight, and I am delighted that we have breeding birds here in Tockholes. I will let you know what the full UK survey reveals in due course, but in the meantime please be considerate if you choose to wander off the woodland paths and disturb our woodcock.
