BOOK CLUB....

Unusually, in July, the book club met to discuss two books.

In May we read 'Stanley' by Tim Jeal. This tome of academic historical writing aims to re-examine the life and work of the famous explorer. Using access to letters and diaries unavailable to previous historians and biographers, Jeal challenges commonly held assumptions about Stanley's life, motives and legacy. He reveals truths about his miserable early life, his drive and ambition which underpinned all his exploits including his remarkable journeys in Africa, as well as his seriousness as a scientist. It explains how, in the shadow of Dr. Livingstone, Stanley accrued negative impressions and judgements in his lifetime which have been amplified subsequently. Claiming to be American he was a victim of anti-American feeling in British society. We learned he had in fact been born in Wales. As a habitual liar to promote himself, and on account of his exaggerations for journalistic effect, along with his tendency to pick fights with authority figures, Stanley had no trouble attracting unfavourable opinion. As book club readers we felt we had learned a lot about the history of the exploration of the African continent by outsiders, its horrors and the political context. Rewarding, but not a light read, it sometimes felt we had homework to finish. We scored it just over 7

In June we turned to the work of a local author, Christina Middleton. The witch and her soul', is a historical novel rooted in the familiar tale of the Lancashire Witch trials. Using the device of the imagined memoirs of Jane Southworth nee Shireburn, the novel traces the undercurrents of the time, religious and political, and the impacts on the lives of the high and low born. It particularly concerns the lives of women and the difficulties they had when any self- expression or behaviour could attract dangerous interpretations and accusations and society's judgement had powerful consequences. We enjoyed the links to the local great houses and locations of the Lancashire Witches story as the novel interweaves the historical inhabitants with each other and uses these encounters to explore what it must have felt like to negotiate daily life, required public worship and personal religious feeling and belief. We felt the memoir device mostly worked well though seemed strained towards the end. The use of archaic language was appropriate but seemed inconsistently used to some. Would we have enjoyed the book as much without some knowledge of the locations and story we could not say? We scored it 8

Next months book is The Rose and the Yew Tree by Mary Westmacott (Agatha Christie)
