#### WI - WOMEN'S INSTITUTE...



Would you know what an Independent Life Cycle Celebrant was if asked, well we certainly found out at our meeting on Tuesday 18th February. Our speaker Claire Sunderland gave us all some food for thought when she told us of her work. Claire is there in a non-religious capacity at key moments in people's lives when they need help and support. Occasions such as the naming of a child, the making of wedding vows and the renewal of wedding vows but the main focus of her work comes at the end of life when she is there to comfort and support families as they say good-bye to loved ones. Claire also conducts the funeral, tailor made to the deceased and the family's requirements. We had a very interesting discussion about death and

dying and the many different way the remains of the deceased can be laid to rest. Some were very surprising and a complete revelation to many of us, the main one being Water Cremation which is apparently the thing of the not too distant future. This is supposed to be the most eco-friendly method of disposal. Rather disturbingly once the process has reached completion the water is treated and returned into the water system for general use and the fact that pacemakers and replacement joints are not destroyed in the process means that these can then be up-cycled for further use came as rather a surprise. It certainly led to a lot of discussion and gave us something to think about on our way home.

Following talk of death we were all very much alive as we tucked into delicious cake and a jolly good chat with friends.

Thanks to Chris Tobin we had a cosy warm meeting on what was a miserable cold wet night. Thank you Chris much appreciated.


The next meeting is on Tuesday 17th March which being St Patricks Day shall have an Irish flavour to it.
