BOOK CLUB....

January's book was 'Only Time Will Tell' by Jeffrey Archer. The first book in a seven book series that make up the Clifton Chronicles; this novel tells the story of the son of a dockworker and his mother, and how their lives intersect with the lives of the Barrington family who own the dockyard.

The book was generally enjoyed by most members. The positive points made were that it's a good story, very easy to read and the quick moving plot meant that everyone wanted to keep on reading to find out what happened. The negative feedback was around the one-dimensional nature of some of the characterisation, and some aspects of the plot that didn't seem feasible. Some members of the group enjoyed the book so much that they've already read further books in the series!

The scores ranged between 6 and 8.5, with the average coming out at 7.

Next month's book is This Thing of Darkness' by Harry Thompson. It's the fictionalised biography of Robert FitzRoy, who was given command of HMS Beagle halfway through her first voyage, and also her second voyage with Charles Darwin as their famous passenger. It has excellent reviews, but worth starting early as it's 700 pages plus!

At our February meeting we welcomed local Solicitor Rhona Royle who spoke about her work for the British High Commission in India as Head of Consular Operations; North East India. Her working title is 'The best job I've ever had'.

Rhona spoke about how she ended up in India and getting her job, she went on to educate as to what us as to what Consular Assistance is and what they can and can't help with.

GWOMEN Part of Rhona's role was to make outreach visits to recruit a network of wardens and volunteers in preparation for any crisis that may occur such as the recent floods in the area.

Rhona detailed some of her more memorable cases such as rescuing a 17 year old British citizen from a forced marriage in Punjab (marriage is illegal under 18 in India), a murder case on a houseboat in Srinagar which is still ongoing several years

later and dealing with the Indian military to airlift a motorcyclist with a broken leg from Leh high up in Jammu Kashmir which took four days to negotiate.

Rhona shared some photographs with us on her slide show which ended with the words of Mahatama Gandi.
