BOOK CLUB....

Review by Terry - this months selection was a book by Canadian novelist Mary Lawson entitled The Other Side of the Bridge.

Arthur and Jake are brothers, yet worlds apart emotionally. Jake is younger and feckless as opposed to Arthur's dependability. The sons of a Canadian farmer in the mid 1930s where life is hard and the threat of another world war is looming.

Enter Laura, the young daughter of the incoming Reverend March into the community. Arthur, solid and dependable, the mainstay on the farm and Jake, handsome, unreliable and a troublemaker, sibling rivalry that underpins the story with a secret between the brothers that happened in early life.

The novel splits between 1930 through to 1960, expertly handling the tragedies and the difficult times of post war Canada.

The most common criticism from some members of book club was that the pace of the novel could have been driven more with pace and that the plot was somewhat without energy.

This is undoubtedly true, however at a mere 250 pages this novel was never going to have the complexities and twists found in a Dickens or a Trollope.

But without doubt this book is a enthralling and very easy read. The author explores the depth of human feelings, strengths and weaknesses, guilt and hope of the characters with great ease and authority.

Despite certain reservations within book club, the novel was very well received with a very respectable score of 8 attained.

Finally, dear reader if you are looking for a good read this book will not disappoint and fit easily into your holiday luggage, or even the pocket of a summer jacket. Sit back, relax and read on.
